They were excited about GDVS standing up the Transition Support Unit as their organizations fund out-patient programs and know there is a need for in-patient services for those with PTSD/TBI, etc. Commissioner Ross then held a weekly Director's Meeting. The afternoon was spent interviewing four candidates for the position of Executive Director, Field Offices and Appeals. Ms. Shelly-Ann Simpson was selected as the incoming Executive Director.

On Thursday, June 30, 2022, Commissioner Ross attended a Unite Us Pre-Implementation Meeting. She then had a meeting regarding the Veterans Health Promotion Program headed by Dr. James Tsai from the Georgia Institute of Technology. Their aim is to develop a program that will improve and enhance physical health, mental well-being, and quality of life for veterans and their family caregivers. The proposed program consists of (1) veterans' engagement in the design, implementation, evaluation, and sustainability of the program; (2) technology-based, personalized physical activity interventions (e.g., walking, Tai Chi, resistance exercise, laughter yoga, etc.); (3) comprehensive health assessments using eye tracking technology, machine learning, and various advanced sensors to personalize and optimize the physical activity interventions; (4) safety and mobility assessments for indoor and outdoor physical activity interventions, including sidewalk mobility and indoor environment assessments using innovative technology. The expected outcomes of this proposed program will have positive impacts on the health, wellness, and quality of life that will ultimately develop a systemic approach to scale up the impact to a large population of veterans and their family caregivers in Georgia and nationwide.

A Tower Garden is a state-of-the-art vertical, aeroponic, garden-growing system that uses sunlight (or plant lights), electricity, nutrients and water to grow vegetables, herbs, fruits or flowers in a three square foot area, indoors or outdoors. This project is meant to allow veterans to be role models and to take a leadership role in the education of others regarding gardening, marketing, business finances and the value of community involvement. They also have a "Bagels, Backpacks and Mats" program. They have a line-item appropriation in the FY23 budget.

### **FINANCE**

### Accounting

On July 1, 2022, Accounting Shared Services, a division of the State Accounting Office, is now providing our accounting and payment services. The scope of services they are providing is accounts

payable, accounts receivable, processing of purchase orders and non-purchase order vouchers, mailing checks/assuring ACH payments are made, process travel vouchers, handling all vendor management requests, managing federal funds, and maintaining general ledger files in accordance with the state's accounting policies. GDVS will continue to submit monthly budget amendments and allotments as required and will analyze the annual operating budget and produce budgetary reports.

### Budget

### FY 2022

The Department ended the 2022 fiscal year (June 30, 2022) within the budgeted appropriations for the year for each of the four fiscal programs (Administration, Cemetery, Nursing Homes, and Veterans Benefits) to include allowances for any late arriving invoices or reclassifications by the State Accounting Office that may occur during development of the State's Consolidated Accounting and Finance Report (CAFR) that will be published before the end of December 2022. Preliminary reviews of the FY 2022 budget and current spending in each of the four fiscal programs indicate GDVS is within budget and on track for a successful closeout on Friday, July 15, 2022.

The annual FY closeout process has been challenging this fiscal year with the loss of key accounting personnel and their subject matter expertise. However, we have taken on the challenge with success. With Accounting Shared Services taking the lead, and members of our administration, operations, human resources, and procurement teams assisting where needed, they have demonstrated their willingness to go above and beyond their regular duties by assisting in the closeout process. We thank them for their tremendous teamwork efforts.

#### FY2023

The FY 2023 Annual Operating Budget (AOB) for GDVS was successfully submitted to the Governor's Office of Planning and Budget (OPB) on June 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2022, for approval and entry into the OPB's tracking system, which is used by the OPB and all state agencies for budget and expenditure monitoring and budget compliance. The AOB is based on the FY 2023 appropriation approved by the General Assembly and the Governor.

Preparations are now underway to develop the department's AFY 2023 and FY 2024 budget request. As of this writing, OPB has not issued the AFY 2023/FY 2024 budget instructions which are the general budget preparation procedures used in preparing agencies amended and proposed budgets for current and upcoming fiscal years. Hopefully we will have the guidance not later than August 1<sup>st</sup>. The department's AFY 2023 and FY 2024 budget requests are due to OPB on Thursday, September 1, 2022.

Commissioner Ross submitted the GDVS FY 2023-2027 Strategic Plan on July 11, 2022.
