DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AFFAIRS LAUNCHES NEW PROGRAM FOR VETERAN HOMEBUYERS

The Georgia Department of Community Affairs (DCA) recently announced a new initiative for veterans seeking home ownership—the Georgia Dream Peach Select Veterans Assistance Loan Program.

An extension of the Georgia Dream initiative, the program offers a low interest rate. However, it differs in one major way—there is no down payment assistance provided as part of the Peach Select Veterans Assistance Loan program.

The program's low interest rates are expected to yield significant cost savings, serving as an alternative to traditional down payment assistance benefits.

Any borrower who qualifies for a traditional Georgia Dream VA loan is eligible to apply starting March 15, 2024. It is available to first-time home buyers, buyers who have not owned a home in the last three years, or those who purchase homes in certain areas. Some income requirements apply.

GEORGIA MILITARY VETERANS HALL OF FAME UNVEILS CLASS OF 2023



On March 12, 2024, JROTC cadets lined the staircase at the Georgia state capitol to unveil the 15 inductees of the 2023 Georgia Military Veterans Hall of Fame (GMVHOF).

Notable inductees for 2023 include former Governor Deal, 2 former Prisoners of War, and GDVS Commissioner Col. (ret.) Patricia Ross, Ed.D.

Governor Kemp, state legislators, veteran service organizations, and Georgia's veterans and their families also celebrated the relocation of the GMVHOF. Guests can now view and read citations for all 177 members during a visit to the State Capitol Building.

The GMVHOF is the only state veteran hall of fame to be located inside of a capitol building.

Inductees are chosen for their Valor, Achievements, or Service to the military and veteran community. The Hall of Fame also works with JROTC cadets to educate and connect them with current and former military service members.
