GDVS HOSTS FIRST ANNUAL SSG FOX FORUM

"He was a big hearted hero," said David Fox of his son, Army Staff Sergeant Parker Gordon Fox, who died by suicide at the age of 25 in 2020.

Fox shared these memories during a recent forum at the Georgia State Capitol focused on suicide prevention awareness, outreach, and mental health resources for active-duty military service members, veterans, and their families.

SSG Fox's parents opened the forum with fond recollections of SSG Fox's life, his generosity, and his profound care for others while stressing the importance of seeking help if or when you are overwhelmed.

"We need a variety of services to identify and address issues earlier with different approaches that cater to each unique case. We've got to surround our heroes and pause or stop them before they make a choice that cannot be undone," said Fox.

The forum was hosted by the Georgia Department of Veteran Services and GreenVeterans, and featured speakers from the Department of Defense's Suicide Prevention Office, VHA's Office of Mental Health and Suicide Prevention, the Georgia Department of Behavioral Health and Disabilities, and Kennesaw State University's Center for the Advancement of Military and Emergency Services (AMES). Chairman of the State Board of Veterans Service and GreenVeterans CEO Shawn Hanley moderated the forum.

Congressmen Austin Scott and Sanford Bishop joined the conference virtually to share messages of support and the importance of providing resources for mental and behavioral health care.

Panelists presented data on suicidality in active-duty service members, veterans and statistics showing they are a distinct group in need of specialized care. The panel also covered current options for care and plans for new research and therapies.
